- Worked with hotel to hire a driver for the day to see some sights not on the tour agenda








Traveled to Lake Elmentaita

 - Ugly 5 Stork, Vulture, Wart Hog, Wildebeest, Hyenas











Travel Tips/Lessons Learned

- When traveling on long overseas flights, consider
 - Going at least one day early to help with jet lag/time zone changes before touring
 - Upgrading flights to provide additional leg room (economy plus for example) if you
 really want to splurge, go for business or first class with lay-flat seats
 - Signing up for Global Entry includes TSA precheck many credit card companies offer to pay the fees, speeds up security checks in the US and upon reentry through Customs and Border Control
 - Trying to fit all items into carry-on luggage to minimize airport time and potential lost luggage – especially if you have additional short flights within the country you are visiting
 - Weather sites for outlook during travel dates for packing
 - Thin-layered clothes to enable a wide range of temperature comfort
 - Small packs for medications, toiletries, electronics and chargers
 - Small packets for washing clothes, techniques to hang dry
 - At least 2 pair of shoes
 - Rain gear never know when you will need it

Travel Tips/Lessons Learned (cont'd)

- Check and make sure cell phone plan is what you need in each country
- Know health requirements for each country and it matters where you arrive from!
- Provided bottled water even for brushing your teeth
- Don't be surprised on level of security checks in and out of hotels (even before entering airports)
- Register with State Department for security alert updates
- Know monetary exchange rate to help with purchases
- KAYAK site helpful for flight searches, planning directly with airlines to book
- Viator for local tours
- Booking.com for hotel planning and booking, sometimes direct
- Did not need to exchange for any currency all took US dollars and preferred them
